
In 2011, Ohio Commission on Fatherhood offered a Community Mobilization Training Opportunity.



early one-hundred of Clark County's leaders took time out of their busy schedules to attend a four-hour planning meeting on Wednesday, September 18th. Representing fifteen sectors, the Leadership Summit on Fatherhood participants entertained each others' ideas for creating a community where responsible fatherhood is celebrated, and healthy fathering is practiced for the benefit of the children.

The goals for each sector will become part of the second edition of the Clark County Action Plan to Promote Responsible Fatherhood. This mobilization initiative is essential for helping the community increase the number of children growing up with involved, committed, and skilled dads.

Fatherhood Clark County Director Eli Williams gave credit for the success of the Summit to the planning committee, saying "the volunteer committee worked very hard to produce an experience that went fast and deep to maximize the gathering of input of the people in the room using the World Café process." He offered special thanks for the contribution of Nancy Flinchbaugh of the City of Springfield Fair Housing office. The planning committee was co-chaired by Scott Griffith of Lee's Chicken, and County Prosecutor Andy Wilson.
