

Milwaukee County Child Support Services



Services Provided

- Educating participants on their role, rights and responsibilities within the Child Support system via Child Support 101 classes.
- Assistance in modifying/adjusting a child support order for an amount commensurate with their ability to pay
- Reduction of state arrears and interest debts
- Referrals to partner agencies for supportive services.

Supportive Services


- The Alma Center –

Ages of Participants




63% of Participants are under the age of 35


Marital Status

Race/Ethnicity




80% of participants are African American




Employment Status
